

Hotel Reservations – Updated Conference Information (EST2005)

New Orleans is one of the most popular tourist cities in the United States; therefore, the Conference Secretariat has reserved the largest possible block of sleeping rooms at the Fairmont Hotel. It is impossible to guarantee that rooms will be available for late registrants. It is extremely important that you make your hotel reservation as soon as you know that you are likely to attend the Conference. Conference registrants can reserve rooms at the Fairmont Hotel at the reduced group rate.

To qualify for the group rate, mention that you are attending the "International Environmental Conference." The promotional code for the reservations is GRIES1. US Government attendees will have to call the 800-number to receive the government per diem rates.
